WHAT SCOPING MEANS

The DeLamar Project is officially entering the federal permitting process under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) on May 22, 2026. The scoping process and public comment period help gather input from communities, Tribal Nations, agencies, and stakeholders as the environmental review moves forward.

Input received during scoping helps inform the topics, resources, and community values considered in the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). Public feedback helps shape both the analysis and the Project's path forward.

We encourage community input to help ensure the topics, concerns, and community values that matter most are thoroughly evaluated throughout the NEPA process. Feedback received during scoping helps inform the environmental analysis and supports a comprehensive review of the DeLamar Project.
